BISHOP AMAT was hustled from between foes to grab lead, sped clear and set uncontested lead into the stretch, remained inside, dug in late and just lasted. MARK'S CAT broke out but quickly recovered and gained stalking position, came in some, tracked pacesetter into the lane, whittled gap late while lugging out under left hand pressure and barely missed. VALLEY SPIRIT showed good early foot, tracked pace from the inside, remained along the rail through the stretch and narrowly lasted for the show. TRICE UP settled off the rail, raced three wide then outside rival, came four wide into the stretch, roused and rallied strongly late from the outside. RUN TO GROUND settled inside, shifted out some early on the turn, continued three wide departing the turn and lacked needed late punch. FLEW FLICKER was off slow, reserved from the inside, saved ground throughout but never menaced. ROYAL STACK reserved from well off the fence, was widest of all to the turn, continued four then three wide and weakened. EL RAYO was also slow to begin, dropped far back early, angled to the rail, remained inside and was outrun.
