Footnotes

OLD ED attended the pace to the second turn, rallied and pushed clear in upper stretch then held under steady urging. MOSCATO stalked the leaders to the second turn, was roused three wide to the stretch, could not catch the winner but was best of the rest. SEEINGISBELIEVING tracked the pace to the second turn, saved ground to the stretch then could not make a late impact. SKIPPY DUE had no speed, saved ground to the second turn, came two wide to the stretch then went evenly in the final furlong. TACO WILLY also had no speed, was roused into the second turn, got fanned four wide to the stretch then made up ground belatedly. LONGITUDE was outrun to the second turn, bid four wide to the stretch but lost his punch in the drive. MT. ORIENT contested the pace from the rail for six furlongs, was outkicked by the winner into the stretch then tired.
