HEIR TO MONEY broke cleanly but took back after the pacesetting duo, moved closer into the second turn, rallied willing two wide into the stretch to gain command at the furlong pole, edged clear then held driving. NINER GENIUS was unhurried in the early going while moving off the rail on the first turn, advanced steadied three wide to the stretch, seemed to hand to mid stretch then was making an impact at the wire. COUNT IT ALL JOY was hustled from the gate and dueled outside MOVE OVER MARINO, disposed of that rival after a half mile to take a clear lead, gave up much of his advantage in the upper stretch, was headed at the furlong pole but raced gamely to the line to hold the show. SPORT KING was void of early speed, saved ground to the stretch but lacked the needed response. STEFANELLI took back early from just off the rail, raced in the two path on the second turn but did not rally. THUNDERCLAP NEWMAN was never a factor. MOVE OVER MARINO was hard used from the gate to duel on a quick pace for a half mile, stopped and was eased in the stretch.
