MCALLISTER BOYS was well placed to the second turn, rallied three wide to the stretch then continued to respond in the drive and wore down SKIP TONY late. SKIP TONY was rated on the front end to the second turn, responded to pressure to the stretch, dug in gamely late but could not stall the winner. BLUEGRASS CHAPP prompted the pace to the second turn, tried to rally from the two path to the stretch but weakened in mid stretch. VANILLA FLAVOR chased the pace to the second turn then saved ground to no avail. GENERAL CAUSEWAY bumped with SILVER TERRACE at the start, had no speed and was never a threat. SILVER TERRACE bumped with GENERAL CAUSEWAY at the start, chased the pace to the second turn, got fanned four deep to the stretch and gave way. ARATHORN had no speed, was always outrun then was eased in mid stretch but walked off.
