Footnotes

RENZO SEAN had the best speed, set the pace to the second turn, responded to pressure and inched away again to mid stretch then dug in gamely under strong urging and got a desperate nod. THE TOUR DIRECTOR was unhurried to the half, bid three wide on the second turn, rallied widest in the stretch, drifted inward and crowded STORMY SURGE leaving mid stretch then continued inward while gaining but was nipped by a nostril. MOSCATO settled early, tracked to the second turn, bid two wide to the stretch then finished willingly late. STORMY SURGE also tracked the pace for five furlongs, was asked two wide on the second turn, responded in the drive then was crowded by the runnerup leaving mid stretch, checked briefly then took up sharply nearing the sixteenth marker when THE TOUR DIRECTOR continued drifting inward. CROWN OF ARAGORN prompted the pace for six furlongs, was two wide to the stretch but lost his punch in the late stages. SIR AL (IRE) chased the pace for a half, saved ground on the second turn but gave way in the drive. Following a jockey's objection by the rider on STORMY SURGE and a steward's inquiry into the stretch run, in a majority decision the stewards let the results stand.
