Footnotes

HIGH INTELLECT settled early, checked between horses leaving the half mile pole, recovered to race two wide to the stretch, rallied steadily to gain command past mid stretch and won driving. HE DID raced unhurried early, circled rivals three wide on the turn and closed steadily from the extreme outside. GO BAROQUE stalked the pace three wide from the outset, took command in the upper stretch but slackened late. SHEEKEY (IRE) lacked sharp early speed but moved up inside nearing the turn, was boxed for much of the turn then tried to get through inside SWISS ALPINE at the furlong pole, steadied, shifted out and closed too late. SWISS ALPINE set the pace and crossed to the inside in the opening quarter, maintained the lead to the head of the lane and weakened. FREE ACTION pressed the pace two wide into the stretch and came up empty.
