SOURDOUGH SAM was unhurried for a half mile, rallied four wide on the second turn, pushed up to duel for the lead to mid stretch then inched clear under steady urging late. OUR MINESWEEPER pressed the pace to the second turn, rallied two wide and was also dueling in upper stretch then was outfinished in the late stages. SWISS MEMO set the pace to the second turn, was overtaken by the top two to the stretch and outrun to mid stretch but kept to his task and was coming back again late. HAIMISH HY settled mid pack to the second turn, bid two wide to the stretch then closed belatedly in the final furlong. PRIVILAGED reared in the gate at the start and lost about six lengths, was asked to get into contention to the backstretch, offered his best bid four wide on the second turn but could not sustain the needed response. WINNER IN OVERTIME was outprinted while three wide to the backstretch, saved ground on the second turn but lacked a late rally. RICHARDSONGDANCE was three wide early, settled to the second turn then gave way after six furlongs.
