GIANT EGO broke alertly then was permitted to slip back off the leaders, commenced his bid four wide once on the turn, reached the leaders in the upper stretch, forged to the front a furlong out and won driving. FLOATING FEATHER broke a bit slow then was unhurried, followed the winner around the field on the turn and finished steadily. OMAR rushed up after the break to gain command in the opening quarter, maintained an advantage to the head of the lane and slackened. GERMANY BAY was asked for speed early, saved ground to the stretch, shifted out for the drive but could only go evenly late. MARSHAL MARINI prompted the pace two wide, forged to the front once in the stretch but slackened in the drive. ALOHA MR. HAND broke three lengths slow and lagged, saved ground to the stretch but could close only a minor gap. JACKSON ROAD tracked the leaders to the turn, offered a menacing bid three wide near the quarter pole then came up empty. PRIME ISSUE pressed the pace three wide to the turn and gave out.
