Footnotes

TITAN OF INDUSTRY reserved early, angled outside a wall of horses for racing room in the stretch and rallied to be up in the final strides. MEAN SAX stalked the pace, raced four wide around the far turn, made a run to reach even terms for command at the eighth pole, vied to deep stretch and couldn't resist the winner while edging EXCELLENT SOLDIER for the place. The latter, rated off the pace, angled out for the stretch run, rallied to gain a slim lead at the eighth pole, vied with MEAN SAX to deep stretch and gave way. STAR PLAYER unhurried early, swung out for the stretch run and closed with a belated rally. SWIFT STRIKE allowed to settle, swung wide for the stretch run and closed ground late without threatening. BROOKLYN BOY off slowly, failed to menace. HARBOR WIN was no factor after being steadied at the start. SINGING ROCK tracked the pace along the rail, made a run to loom a threat in midstretch, then tired. OSCEOLA PRINCE was outrun after lunging at the start. OPPORTUNE MOMENT chased the pace three wide into the stretch and faltered. JEBSTER vied for the lead along the rail into the stretch, then faded. NOTHING IMPOSSIBLE vied for the lead outside JEBSTER to nearing the stretch, then had nothing left.
