BARELY PERFECT off slowly, rushed up into contention racing down the backstretch, moved to take over on the turn and was fully extended to prevail. CRACK THE BOOKS showed speed along the inside, was outmoved by the winner on the turn and into the stretch, then finished willingly to hold the place. SUNSHINE DREAMER reserved early, rallied along the rail to gain the show. SNOW KIPPER rated off the pace, raced three wide on the turn and lacked a late response. MOOCHIE TOO chased the leaders along the inside into the stretch and weakened. CATNABOUT saved ground and passed tired rivals. PRINCESS ALERT was no factor after being outrun early. DIAMOND MINE was outrun while racing three wide. NATASHA'S RENO raced in striking position for a half mile and faltered. ACTCENTUATE stumbled at the start, chased the pace three wide into the stretch and faded. NIGHTINGALE was done early.
