ROMAN CANDLES reserved along the inside, steadied in behind the leaders entering the first turn, angled out for the drive and rallied to be up late. SUMMER MAN vied for the lead three wide into the turn, contested the pace with MR. COLD CALL to past the eighth pole, then continued on with good courage while being edged to the wire in the closing yards. MR. COLD CALL vied for the lead along the inside to past the eighth pole and weakened. HOLE IN THE HEAD chased the leaders three wide into the stretch and gave way. JUNE THE TIGER outrun after breaking awkwardly, failed to menace. SMOKE WARNING showed brief speed and tired. SILVER TRAIN showed early foot and faltered. FIREBROOK off slowly, was outrun.
