CANOE CREEK bumped and steadied at the start, rallied four wide on the turn, took over at the eighth pole, drifted in while opening a clear lead, then was all out to dead heat with ROAD POKER. The latter, stumbled at the start, saved ground around the turn, rallied to reach even terms for command at the eighth pole, was outmoved, then continued on willingly outside CANOE CREEK to finish on even terms with that rival for the win. U SO FINE allowed to settle, raced five wide on the turn and rallied to be up for the show while unable to catch the top ones. TOWNS HONOR unhurried early, closed with a belated rally. VERMONTER bumped with CANOE CREEK at the start, chased the pace three wide around the turn and weakened. NATIVE WAGER failed to menace after being outrun early. GODIVA'S DANCER was outrun. PEMBROK PINES was not a factor. SHEERS SANDY pressed the pace outside BINAWONDER, took over on the turn, then faltered in the stretch run. BRITTNISLILGHOST broke awkwardly, chased the leaders three wide around the turn and faded. BINAWONDER bumped with CANOE CREEK at the start, showed speed along the rail, then stopped abruptly and was eased in the final eighth.
