DUBAI ECHO chased the pace, moved to take over entering the far turn and opened a clear lead, then was fully extended to hold sway. HERECOMESEVERYMAN rated off the pace after being steadied in the early going, raced four wide around the far turn and rallied while just saving the place. ELEVEN FINAL FOURS allowed to settle, angled out in the stretch and closed with a late rush to just miss the place. EXETER ROAD steadied twice in the early going, saved ground into the stretch, then closed well to just miss the show. SETON HALL reserved along the inside after being caught in tight early, gained some ground in the drive without threatening. VIVA MONGOLIA tracked the leaders into the stretch, then didn't do enough late. DALAXY failed to menace. MACARTHUR CAUSEWAY set the pace along the rail to the far turn, then tired. BLUEMBER was not a factor. PROFESSOR PALMER stalked the pace three wide into the far turn and faltered.
