Footnotes

STAN THE TAP MAN broke inwards, was hustled clear of his foes racing nearest the rail in the opening furlong, held sway on a clear margin to upper stretch and was kept to steady pressure to maintain his advantage. HOUSE OF USHER angled to the rail in the opening stages to track the pacesetter inside a rival in second flight, couldn't gain terms with the winner, but shifted off the inside entering the lane while proving best of the others. BETTER MAKE MONEY was rated in hand four deep racing just off the second flight racing to the turn, made some progress in that path racing into upper stretch and edged a rival for a share late. CARTOUCHE tracked just off the second flight three wide racing to the turn and continued evenly between foes to late stages while being just outfinished for a share. COLLIDIN broke sharply, tracked the pacesetter from just out of striking distance outside a rival racing to the turn, then steadily faded racing through the stretch. SOUL COAXING raced unhurried outside foes in the opening stages, angled to the inside entering the turn but lacked any closing response.
