Footnotes

FAST PROMISES was settled well off the second flight near the inside in the opening half, made steady progress racing into the far turn to bid four deep between rivals nearing upper stretch, gained a narrow advantage approaching the furlong marker and just held LITTLE FEAT to the end under firm encouragement. The latter, reserved off the second flight while working his way to the inside in the opening stages, switched out on the far turn to split foes three wide nearing upper stretch, altered course to the rail nearing the furlong marker to challenge inside the leaders, drew on terms with the winner late and just missed. QUIET REVOLUTION, forwardly placed three deep racing into the first turn, was eased off the leaders to track outside in second flight in the opening half, moved to challenge three wide entering the far turn, dueled for command between foes to midstretch but couldn't match terms with the top pair late. APACHE STORM tracked the leaders three deep racing well off the second flight in the opening half, swung out five wide nearing upper stretch and continued with a mild bid. COUNT DE BARAN, held up out of tight quarters at the start, raced unhurried to the second bend a bit off the inside, swung out six wide racing into upper stretch and made some belated progress. SIR REDFORD settled along the inside in the opening half, shifted out to split foes three wide racing into upper stretch but made no impression on the leaders. SHOW YOUR FACE, reserved off the second flight in the opening stages, moved to striking distance while caught five wide racing through the far turn and flattened out in upper stretch. DENALI SLEW broke inwards momentarily impeding his entymate, attended the pace outside a rival racing to the backstretch, dueled for command between foes on the far turn and quickly came up empty entering upper stretch. JUNGLE HEART sped to the lead along the inside, set the pace on a narrow margin into the far turn and gave way abruptly. GUT KING tracked the leaders along the inside in second flight in the opening half, steadily retreated entering the far turn.
