Footnotes

SACRED HONOR sped to the fore along the inside racing into the first turn, dictated the pace on a narrow margin into the second bend, forged clear racing into upper stretch and drew away from her foes under firm encouragement. PERFECT STRANGER was urged to contention four deep racing into the first turn, continued three deep tracking the pacesetter into the second bend, made a brief bid in that path nearing upper stretch, couldn't match strides with the winner but just edged a rival for place honors. EASTERN PRECIPICE was urged to terms with the leader attending that foe's pace in the opening stages, pressed the issue between foes on the far turn to upper stretch, couldn't match the winner and was outfinished for second. TWILIGHT MEMORY tracked off the first flight under rating while shifting to the inside in the opening stages, led the second fight into the far turn but couldn't produce the needed closing response. JEFFELL tracked the leaders outside a rival in the second flight racing to the far turn but lacked a rally. DARLAND, reserved outside foes in the opening half, angled four wide racing into upper stretch gaining some position but made no impression. MULATA was settled off the second flight racing just off the inside early, continued between foes in that position into the second bend but never seriously menaced. THE BEST OPTION, reserved in last while working her way to the inside early, never threatened.
