KIPLING'S KING, brushed at the start, shifted off the inside early to track just off the first flight, moved to challenge four deep racing into the turn, continued to force the issue outside a rival while angling nearer to the inside approaching upper stretch and edged clear leaving the furlong marker under steady right handed encouragement. CREATIVE ART joined the pace outside a rival soon after the break, vied for command three deep between foes racing into the bend, shifted to the inside nearing upper stretch while continuing to force the issue into upper stretch but proved only second best. TYKER broke readily to dispute the pace inside a rival from the outset, dropped off the pace entering the turn, shifted out three wide racing into upper stretch and continued with a steady effort to regain some position late while never menacing the top pair. SPLASHES STORM settled into stride a bit off the inside early, then continued evenly three deep on the turn to upper stretch but lacked the needed closing response. SHAMAN broke outwards brushing the eventual winner, pulled his way to contention inside the first flight racing into the bend but emptied out early. VALMOR, reluctant to load in the starting gate, was urged along five deep while quickly dropping off the leaders and never proved any factor.
