Footnotes

POWERSFIELD, held up between foes racing just off the pacesetter in the opening stages, angled to the rail midway through the backstretch while moving to terms with the leader, pressed the issue inside that foe racing through the second bend, wrested a narrow advantage in upper stretch and was driven clear racing nearest the rail to the end. SUMMER SERVANT hopped at the start, was reserved off the leaders racing three deep to the backstretch, shifted out to challenge four wide racing into the second bend, couldn't match terms with the winner but proved best of the others. MANET, forwardly placed along the inside stalking just off the pacesetter racing to the backstretch, dropped well off the leaders after a half while switching off the inside, shifted out racing into upper stretch and made a second effort to gain some position while no menace to the top pair. J COOL, reserved near the inside racing to the far turn, shifted out racing into upper stretch but never gained contention. MOST DISTINCT gained terms with the leader attending that foe's pace in the opening stages, pressed the pace three deep between foes racing into the far turn and gave way entering upper stretch. CLASSIC RECITAL moved to the fore from the break racing a bit off the inside, dictated the pace on a narrow margin under firm rating to the second bend, dueled between foes through the far turn but came up empty in upper stretch.
