**Footnotes**

HOLY KROEMER was guided to the inside to stalk just off the first flight in hand, continued under reserve into the second bend awaiting an opening, shifted out three deep in upper stretch while moving to challenge, was floated out in late stages but continued with a sustained response to just edge SILVER CRUSH in time under firm handling. The latter gained terms with a rival on the pace, attended that foe's tempo under rating for a half, increased the tempo on the far turn, edged clear racing into upper stretch, drifted out under left handed pressure while grudgingly resisting the winner but came up second best. UTESA tracked the pace outside foes in the second flight, advanced to press the leaders three deep racing into the far turn but drifted out and steadily faded entering upper stretch. ELECTRIC BOAT was urged to fore along the inside dictating the pace on a narrow margin into the backstretch, dueled for command inside foes on the far turn and weakened when failing to match the top pair in the final quarter. CANDLE CLOCK hesitated at the start, switched out four wide while coming under some pressure to gain contention racing to the backstretch and was through after a half.
