SAILING ALONG broke inwards bumping DISTANT BUGLE, was quickly righted, moved to the fore while angling to the rail racing into the first turn, dictated the pace on a narrow margin into the second bend, turned back a challenger near midstretch and held safe the challenge of DAD ARE WE HERE to late stages under strong handling. The latter secured a forward placing three deep racing into the first turn, tracked off and outside the first flight under reserve in the opening half, moved to challenge in that path on the far turn, angled to the rail leaving midstretch while moving to terms with the winner in late stages but came up second best. HOLY FEVER, forwardly placed along the inside racing into the first turn, shifted outside the pacesetter nearing the backstretch stalking that rival, pressed the issue racing on the far turn into upper stretch but weakened late when failing to match terms. CAPTAIN AMERICAN tracked just off the leaders in second flight along the inside racing into the backstretch, saved ground to upper stretch but lacked the needed final response. CHIEF CHICAGO broke slowly, pulled his way to position to position just off the second flight along the inside, shifted outside foes racing into upper stretch but offered no rally. PANAMA HAT was settled off the inside from just out of striking distance, made a brief, four wide bid racing into the far turn but soon dropped out of contention. DISTANT BUGLE, bumped at the start, was collected to track between foes, gained a position in second flight after a half but emptied out leaving the far turn.
