DARRELL SAYS, in close attendance to the pace three deep in the opening stages, advanced in that path entering the turn to force the issue, continued in an extended skirmish racing past the furlong marker and narrowly edged BATTLE FACTS in late stages under steady right handed encouragement. The latter, urged to the lead along the inside from the outset, dueled for command on the turn into upper stretch, grudgingly resisted the winner to the end but came up second best. OFFICER NINO prompted the pace between foes racing into the bend, vied for command into upper stretch but weakened late when failing to match the top pair. PANAMA HAT, allowed to settle along the inside from well out of striking distance early, shifted out to split foes after a half, switched back to the rail nearing the furlong marker and made some belated progress along the rail. NATURDAY, held up off the first flight while caught four deep early, shifted inwards a bit on the bend tracking the pace, swung out four wide entering upper stretch but lacked the needed final response. FRIDAY, urged to secure a forward placing five deep in the opening quarter, chased the first flight into the bend but gave way early. ANY GIVEN TIME, taken in hand soon after the break to be reserved well off the pace, tracked the leaders well off the inside racing to upper stretch but offered no rally. WILD COMMAND hopped a bit at the start, chased the leaders along the inside in the opening quarter but dropped out early.
