Footnotes

HAWK ON THE HUNT secured a narrow advantage inside foes racing into the first turn, dictated the pace under light rating racing to the far turn, edged clear entering the second bend, then held sway to the end while drifting out in the final stages under firm encouragement. AL NASR DREAM (IRE) broke outwards, was reserved in hand just off the second flight racing off the inside in the opening half, shifted out midway through the second bend to split foes three deep, continued in that path through the stretch to challenge but was always second best. LITTLE FEAT, reserved in second flight tracking the leaders along the rail to the far turn, saved ground to upper stretch and continued willingly to earn a share while no match for the top pair. LANDING CHASER settled outside foes in the opening half, continued a bit off the inside on the second bend, swung out five wide in upper stretch and made an effort to improve his position. JUMPIN JACK CAT, forwardly placed three deep from the break, tracked just off the pacesetter for a half, lodged a brief bid three deep racing through the far turn but flattened out in upper stretch. PEARL EXPRESS, unprepared for the start, broke awkwardly, tracked off the second flight outside foes to the far turn, was caught four wide racing through the second bend and steadily faded from contention. MR. SEABRA, forwardly placed between foes, tracked just off the pacesetter in the opening half and emptied out racing through the far turn. COMELATELEAVEARLY tracked the leaders from out of striking distance off the inside, raced wide to upper stretch and lacked response.
