KLIPIT, reserved in hand outside a rival racing to the backstretch, shifted to the inside nearing the far turn commencing his advance, switched outside foes leaving the far turn to challenge four wide in upper stretch and responded to firm encouragement to wrest command and kick clear late. GAMES BEGIN broke slowly, then was shuffled back avoiding close quarters at the start, settled into stride along the rail racing to the backstretch, made steady progress inside foes racing into the far turn, was urged to challenge along the rail when presented an opening entering upper stretch, was roused to the lead near the furlong marker but couldn't match terms with the winner late. DOUBLE CROSSING (IRE), a bit rank while pulling between foes racing to the backstretch, stalked just off the pacesetter to the second bend, was urged to briefly press the issue between foes racing into upper stretch but lacked the needed final kick. SOMEWHERE IN TIME, reserved off the second flight in the opening half, couldn't produce the needed late response. SUN TIME was urged to the lead while angling to the the inside, dictated the pace on a narrow margin into the second bend, dueled briefly into upper stretch and gave way. CLASSIC RECITAL, caught four wide racing to the backstretch, retreated from contention early. ROUND MIDNIGHT displayed some brief pace between foes racing to the backstretch but dropped out nearing the far turn.
