Footnotes

IDEAL ALLUVIAL, never far back, was rated along the inside stalking the pacesetter under light reserve racing to the far turn, came through inside foes to challenge midway through the second bend when presented an opening, pressed the issue to upper stretch, lost some ground to a rival nearing midstretch but produced a solid second effort in the final stages to edge that foe on the wire under firm handling and some left handed encouragement. JACK'S TIGER tracked the pace outside a rival in second flight while maintaining striking distance in the opening half, moved to challenge four deep racing through the far turn, gained a narrow advantage three deep in upper stretch and just failed to contain the winner on the wire. ROCK ON RICHIE settled off the second flight a bit off the inside for six furlongs, angled four wide racing into upper stretch and found his best stride in the closing stages to just miss. NUCKSER, forwardly placed tracking a rival's pace in the opening half, was urged to press the issue between foes midway through the far turn, failed to match the leaders racing into upper stretch, was steadied out of close quarters leaving the three sixteenths marker, shifted out racing through the stretch but couldn't menace further. MING GLO broke awkwardly losing position to the field and never gained contention. BINGORUN was urged to the lead along the inside soon after the start, set the pace racing into the far turn while a bit off the rail and emptied out abruptly after six furlongs.
