Footnotes

TAKING CHARGE tracked the leaders from just out of striking distance under light rating in the opening stages, steadily moved to terms with the first flight bidding for command three deep between foes after a half, gained a narrow advantage entering upper stretch and drew clear under strong handling. RACK DADDY tracked the leaders outside a rival in the second flight in the opening stages, advanced in tandem with the winner racing four wide into the turn to challenge for command after a half but proved no match for that foe in the last furlong. GRAN TORINE settled outside a rival from well off the second flight in the opening quarter, shifted out three wide racing into upper stretch and continued with some interest to improve position. MINE SHAFT GOLD settled in the last flight along the inside, saved ground to upper stretch and passed inside some tiring foes. ARTFUL BEE moved to the fore along the inside soon after the break, disputed the pace along the rail racing into the bend but gave way entering upper stretch. CLOCKER BOB went up to prompt the pace outside a rival from the break, dueled for command between foes racing through the turn and emptied out after a half.
