Footnotes

AZEG stumbled at the start, was quickly righted, then urged between foes near the inside to gain a position just off the first flight, saved some ground on the bend steadily drawing into striking distance, shifted outside the pacesetter while moving to terms with that foe nearing midstretch and narrowly prevailed in time under firm encouragement. GITA'S MAHAL was urged through close quarters to secure the lead along the inside, dictated the pace into upper stretch, resisted the winner's bid to late stages but came up second best. RICHARD'S TUNE, in touch with the pacesetter between foes prompting that rival racing into the bend, shifted out three deep in upper stretch and continued willingly to the end while just failing to match terms with the top pair. RANCHO VIEJO dropped off the leaders racing four wide in early stages, angled out five wide in upper stretch and made an effort to gain some position. FROSTBITE FALLS, within striking distance three deep in the opening stages, chased the pacesetter in that path into the turn and steadily faded after a half. DELUX DEELITE ducked outwards at the start, was righted to track the leaders along the inside racing into the bend but steadily retreated nearing upper stretch.
