FIRST AMERICAN allowed to settle early, rallied four wide on the far turn to gain command at the top of the stretch and drew clear while racing an erratic course under pressure. FORTY ONE CARATS stalked the pace three wide, took over command on the far turn but was no match for the winner while continuing on with good courage for the place. VISION AND VERSE checked bumping PRIME DIRECTIVE when caught in tight racing into the first turn, advanced into contention inside horses down the backstretch but had nothing left for the stretch run. SILVER SEASON reserved off the pace, lost position racing down the backstretch and failed to menace. SHUT OUT TIME set the pace racing off the rail and faltered after losing the lead on the far turn. PRIME DIRECTIVE, off slowly, was bumped by VISION AND VERSE racing into the first turn, then was bumped by VALID REPRIZED midway of the first turn, moved up outside down the backstretch to reach the leaders entering the far turn and faded. VALID REPRIZED checked and bumped with PRIME DIRECTIVE on the first turn and was not a factor. CRYPTODIPLOMACY was through early.
