Footnotes

LETHAL INSTRUMENT five wide early, chased off the rail on the backstretch, advanced four wide on the turn and into the stretch, gained the lead outside past the eighth pole and gamely prevailed under steady handling. PIE N BURGER dueled between horses then outside a rival into and on the turn, fought back between horses in the stretch and continued willingly to the wire. RADIATA had good early speed and dueled on a short advantage inside but off the rail, also fought back in the stretch and went on gamely to the end. FUTURAL stalked the pace between horses then outside a rival, split foes leaving the turn, bid inside in the stretch but could not summon the needed late response. TOP HIT saved ground chasing the leaders, came out in midstretch and lacked the necessary response. HADRIAN'S WALL steadied in tight between horses early, angled to the rail on the backstretch and saved ground off the pace, came out in the stretch and was not a threat. JOHN DOOL (BRZ) forced the early pace outside, dropped back leaving the backstretch and on the turn, came four wide into the stretch and gave way.
