Footnotes

TOMBSTONE (ARG) saved ground stalking the pace, came out into the stretch, bid between horses past the eighth pole and gamely prevailed under left handed urging. KELA had good early speed and vied for command four wide, dropped back a bit into the stretch, then came back on late. STAR CHIEF dueled between horses to the stretch, battled outside a rival in midstretch, fought back inside the top pair in deep stretch but could not match those two late. INSTANT KARMA also flashed keen early foot, dueled inside until just past midstretch, then weakened. TYLER REX wide early, chased outside on the backstretch and outside a rival on the turn and improved position. ENCHANTED OAK unhurried off the inside on the backstretch and outside a rival on the turn, split horses in midstretch and also improved position. VITESSE off a bit slowly, settled off the rail then three deep on the turn and did not rally. VALID REDRESS set or forced the pace three deep between horses until nearing the stretch, then weakened. JACKSON SUNDOWN allowed to settle off the rail, angled to the fence for the turn and failed to menace. SOUD was in a good position chasing the pace outside a rival on the backstretch and a bit off the rail on the turn and weakened. HAPPY HERO saved ground off the pace, came out into the stretch and was not a factor.
