### Footnotes

DOC HOLIDAY (IRE) had good early speed and set the pace along the inside, responded when challenged on the backstretch and again on the second turn, inched away in the stretch and held on gamely. JOHAR saved ground stalking the pace, came out a bit leaving the backstretch, bid three deep on the second turn and into the stretch and continued willingly outside the winner but could not get by. GOLDEN ARROW was in a good position stalking the winner outside a rival, came out a bit in the stretch, could not match the top pair but edged a foe for third. TRUE PHENOMENON angled in and saved ground chasing the leaders, pulled his way along on the backstretch, continued inside and lacked the needed rally. LINE RIDER stalked or forced the pace outside the winner, bid between horses on the second turn, dropped back some nearing the stretch and weakened.
