Footnotes

BUDROYALE settled outside, bid three deep into the second turn, dueled outside BUSY LITTLE BEAVER, kicked clear nearing the stretch and proved best under a steady hand ride, then was under a long hold at the wire. DEL MAR GRAY was allowed to lag back early, moved up inside early on the second turn, came out four wide leaving that bend and outfinished MATEO for second. MATEO settled outside LITERAL PROWLER, came out on the second turn, split rivals three deep into the stretch and lost the place late. LITERAL PROWLER, saved ground off the pace, split horses on the second turn, lacked room briefly off heels into the stretch but did not rally when clear. MARCH OF KINGS, four wide on the first turn, continued off the inside and did not rally. BUSY LITTLE BEAVER chased the leader off the inside, bid between horses into the second turn, dueled inside the winner on that bend and had little left for the stretch. IT'S A REALITY sped to the lead and angled to the rail, held a clear advantage until nearing the second turn, offered little resistance when challenged, dropped back, gave way, and was eased late.
