Footnotes

CAME HOME had speed outside a rival to stalk the early pace, took the lead outside KAMSACK early on the backstretch, duelled on a short advantage, turned back a pair of bids from between horses on the second turn, inched away and angled in nearing the stretch and proved best under urging to send C.J. out a winner. TRACEMARK angled in and saved ground close up, stalked along the rail, bid inside on the second turn, came out into the stretch, could not match the winner but was clearly best of the rest. CALKINS ROAD broke inward and steadied at the start, split horses into the first turn, stalked outside a rival then went three deep into and on the second turn and into the stretch and picked up the show. KAMSACK sped to the early lead a bit off the rail, dropped back and stalked between horses on the backstretch, angled in leaving the second turn and weakened. FONZ'S squeezed back at the start, angled in early, settled a bit off the rail then came off the inside into the backstretch, angled out leaving the second turn and four wide into the stretch and did not rally. TRUE PHENOMENON in a good position outside early, bid three deep on the backstretch, vied outside the winner then three wide again on the second turn, dropped back and angled in approaching the stretch and weakened.
