MY SWEET LUCY five wide early and four wide into the first turn, forced the pace outside a rival, took a short lead into the second turn and drew clear in the stretch under a steady hand ride. BELLA VOLARE sped to a short early lead and angled in, dueled inside the winner, was no match for that one in the stretch but clearly second best. BABY BEANS steadied in tight off heels into the first turn, angled in and saved ground, cut the corner into the stretch and picked up the show. D LISH BELLS close up stalking the pace inside, came out leaving the second turn and weakened. GRANDMA'S BELLS between horses early, tracked the dueling leaders outside a rival, came three deep into the stretch, then angled in and had nothing left.
