STREET BOSS settled off the rail, moved up four wide on the turn and five wide into the stretch, made the lead in midstretch, drifted in and gamely prevailed under a couple taps of the whip and steady handling. ELITE SQUADRON went up inside to duel for the lead, inched away into the turn, fought back along the inside in the stretch and went willingly to the wire. TROPIC STORM pulled his way along to stalk between horses, went three deep on the turn and four wide into the stretch with a bid and bested the rest. GLOBAL HUNTER (ARG) stalked outside then three deep on the backstretch and turn and could not offer the necessary response. DESERT CODE chased a bit off the rail then inside, split rivals into the stretch and lacked the needed late kick. HIGH STANDARDS sped to the early lead, dueled outside the runner-up, dropped back into and on the turn and weakened.
