PROPOSED had good early speed and dueled a bit off the rail, inched away inside on the turn, kicked clear and was under a mild hand ride until being briskly ridden in the final strides to hold sway. DANCING GENERAL chased outside a rival, came out on the turn and three deep into the stretch and closed willingly. SPECIAL FAVOR dueled three deep on the backstretch and into the turn, stalked off the rail on the bend and just held third. CATCH THE JOY saved ground chasing the pace, split rivals leaving the turn, came out some and just missed the show. SHE'S HILARIOUS climbing off the rail early, steadied and was forced out nearing the turn, came three deep into the stretch and failed to menace. BAKERSFIELD CHAMP chased between horses then off the rail, lugged out into the turn and again early on the bend and was steadied, angled in leaving the turn and weakened. INSIDE CHANCE chased three deep on the backstretch and outside a rival on the turn and also weakened. ULTIMATE SUMMER vied for command between horses on the backstretch, dropped back and angled in on the turn and had little left for the stretch.
