AWESOME GEM stalked the pace inside, came out a bit then angled in off heels approaching midstretch, bid along the rail, gained the advantage a sixteenth out under left handed urging and gamely prevailed. RAIL TRIP stalked outside a rival then three and four wide on the backstretch, fell back some on the second turn, came four wide into the stretch, bid outside foes in midstretch, took a short lead past the eighth pole, fought back outside the winner in the final sixteenth but was outfinished. RICHARD'S KID pulled a bit and stalked between horses, bid between rivals in midstretch, could not match the top pair but held third. TRES BORRACHOS broke in the air and slowly, chased outside or off the rail, angled in alongside a rival into the stretch and lacked the needed rally. COMPARI took the early lead and set a moderate pace under a long hold a bit off the rail, battled between horses in midstretch, drifted in late and weakened. CIGAR MAN stalked inside then came off the rail on the first turn, tracked the leader between foes on the backstretch and second turn, came three deep into the stretch and also weakened.
