Footnotes

HEART FEVER squeezed at the start, angled in and settled inside, came off the rail on the turn, went around a rival nearing the stretch, came out in the drive, rallied under left handed urging to gain the lead in deep stretch and proved best. SHY HUMOR chased three deep then outside a rival, continued off the rail leaving the turn, came out into the stretch, took the lead alongside a foe past the eighth pole, was between horses in deep stretch and held second. GRUMPY'S PICK stalked a bit off the rail then inside on the turn, came out into the stretch, inherited a short lead in midstretch, fought back while drifting in some in deep stretch and bested the rest. A DAY AWAY settled outside a rival then off the rail, went around a foe leaving the turn then found the rail into the stretch, steadied and altered path sharply outward at the spill in midstretch and lacked the needed rally. ROYAL ALEXANDER sent inside to press the pace, came a bit off the rail to stalk the pace approaching the backstretch, dropped back between foes midway on the turn, gave way and was eased late. CAROL'S LEGACY angled in and dueled outside a rival, inched away just past the half mile pole and angled in, opened a clear advantage, then ducked into the inner rail and lost the rider nearing the eighth pole. The stewards conducted an inquiry into the stretch run before ruling CAROL'S LEGACY was the cause of her own trouble.
