FONZ'S pulled his way up between horses on the backstretch, dueled three deep between foes then outside POPULAR through the final furlong and gamely prevailed under left handed urging. POPULAR went up inside to press the pace on the backstretch, put a head in front nearing the turn, dueled gamely inside thereafter but could not quite match the winner late. LABAMTA BABE between horses early, took back outside a rival on the backstretch and off the rail on the turn, came out in upper stretch and picked up the show. DIAL A HERO bumped at the start, settled off the rail, angled in some leaving the backstretch, came out into the stretch and passed tiring rivals. HEAVYWEIGHT CHAMP bobbled a bit at the start, had speed off the rail then dueled between horses to midstretch and weakened in the final furlong. ROMAN DANCER had good early speed and dueled four wide between horses, dropped back a bit nearing the stretch and also weakened. ROYAL MORO was in a good position pressing the pace five wide, also fell back leaving the turn and had little left for the drive.
