SONG OF SUMMER came off the rail on the backstretch, split horses on the turn, came four wide into the stretch, bid three deep and took command in midstretch then drew clear under steady handling. SEA REEL stalked outside on the backstretch and turn, came five wide into the stretch and was second best. PARADE OF GOLD went up to prompt the pace outside a rival on the backstretch and turn and between horses into the stretch, then weakened in the final furlong but held third. HARVEST GIRL had good early speed and dueled inside to midstretch, then weakened. ENHANCING close up stalking the pace outside on the backstretch, bid three deep on the turn but weakened in the drive. SMART START broke out a bit, chased off the rail then split horses leaving the backstretch, angled in and dropped back on the turn and also weakened. LUREFAN close up inside early, steadily dropped back and also gave way.
