Footnotes

ILE DE FRANCE a bit wide into the first turn, chased outside then three deep leaving the backstretch and on the second turn, came six wide into the stretch, bid three deep in midstretch and proved best under some urging. SMART LACY off a bit slowly then clipped heels when squeezed in the opening strides, settled a bit off the rail, inched forward inside into and on the second turn, split rivals three deep into the stretch, took a short lead, battled between horses in midstretch, fought back inside the winner to the wire but could not quite match that one late, then returned bleeding from the left fore. GOLDEN BAND saved ground stalking the pace, slipped through inside into the stretch, battled along the rail but settled for the show. RIDAA chased outside, advanced four wide into and on the second turn and seven wide into the stretch but lacked the needed late kick. PREMIERE EVENT stalked the pace off the rail, came five wide between horses into the stretch and could not offer the necessary response. SUMMERWOOD sped to the early lead, set a pressured pace inside, was between horses into the stretch and weakened. RUNWAY LOLLIPOP (ARG) stalked the early pace a bit off the rail, bid outside the leader on the backstretch and second turn, was four wide between foes into the stretch and also weakened.
