Footnotes

INDIAN JONES chased outside a rival then between horses on the backstretch, angled to the inside on the second turn, inched forward into the stretch, came out past midstretch and surged between foes under urging to get up late. UZZIAH sped to the early lead and angled in, set the pace inside, inched away from foes again on the second turn, kicked clear and held on well but was caught late. JAZZMAN'S DANCE stalked outside a rival then off the rail, bid between horses into the second turn, continued just off the fence leaving that turn, came out some past midstretch and continued willingly three deep on the line. BAY RUSH saved ground chasing the pace, came out into the stretch and lacked a further response. BLAZING a bit slow to begin, came out on the first turn, went up four wide on the backstretch then outside a rival on the second turn, angled three deep into the stretch and could not offer the necessary late kick. PLEASANT EARTH reluctant to load, went four wide into the first turn then stalked outside or off the rail, came four wide into the stretch and weakened. THUNDERCLAP NEWMAN stalked a bit off the rail then between foes on the backstretch, dropped back on the second turn, came out into the stretch and gave way.
