GRAND TRAVERSE chased the pace early, angled into the four path in the turn then made a bid in the stretch and edged clear in the final stages. SCATTERFIELD pressed the pace early, angled into the three path in the turn then took over and led in the stretch but yielded late in the drive. KITTY'S TURN was well placed early, angled off the rail into the turn then made a bid in the stretch but hung in the late stages. OUR ROCK STAR set the pace early, angled off the rail into the turn and faltered late in the stretch drive. CLASS READY angled into the five path in the turn and improved position. SEA SONG'S HAMMER was through after a half. MAN FROM MARS was done early. STATESBORO BLUES had brief speed then folded up.
