Footnotes

J T'S PRINCES was prominent from the start, surged to the lead nearing the five-sixteenths marker, inched away outside the sixteenth pole, and held gamely under right hand urging. LADIES DANCE was void of speed, remained well back through the turn, came four wide into the stretch, and closed strongly near the middle of the track. CHANELS STAR was ridden along to be up close, lost position and dropped back entering the turn, rallied five wide into the stretch, closed well to loom a threat into the final sixteenth, but drifted about late and missed. GENUINE PAT broke outward and hit the gate, was ridden along on the outside, moved up to contest the lead midway through the turn, battled into deep stretch, and was outfinished. GIRLS RULE raced just off the pace while between rivals, was in tight in upper stretch, and finished willingly while lacking the needed kick. BRASS KAT was allowed to settle into stride, raced well back into the stretch, gained ground in the final furlong, and was bothered late in a blanket finish. RUHL WITH APPROVAL drifted out after the start, raced near the middle of the tightly bunched field, came four wide leaving the turn, drifted inward in upper stretch, and weakened. LIL'S ANGEL broke inward at the start, settled well off the pace, saved ground on the turn, steadied while blocked inside the three-sixteenths marker, and failed to rally. BABY JEWEL set the pace under heavy pressure, lost the lead midway through the turn, and stopped in the stretch.
