Footnotes

KWIK unhurried early, raced a bit erratic while being restrained off the early pacesetters, advanced along the inside down the backstretch, rallied one from the rail on the final turn, and wore SUPER STEVE down in the final strides. SUPER STEVE away alertly, quickly sprinted to a clear advantage entering the first turn, drifted just off the rail entering the backstretch, turned back a mid race challenge by GREAT PRINCE, but was unable to hold KWIK off in the final strides. GREAT PRINCE broke sharply, stalked the pacesetter from along the rail, quickly engaged SUPER STEVE for the lead upon entering the backstretch while racing along the rail, gained a narrow advantage mid way down the backside, but lacked the needed response in the final furlong. FULL POWER AHEAD no speed early, trailed the field to the top of the stretch, and passed a couple tiring rivals facing five wide in the lane. OLAXSA away well, chased the leader three wide early, but faded in the final furlong. HENRY WEST chased the pace racing one from the rail, but had little left for the drive.
