THESEFOOLISHTHINGS hustled along, pressed the pace from three wide, rallied, closed and was up in the final strides, driving. SPRING SOIREE broke sharply, gained command from the inside, set a pressured pace, just failed to last. PRIVATE MAMBO pinched back at the start, trailed for the first five eighths, rallied on the inside, closed and finished well. MACLOGAN away alertly and close up, chased the leaders from off the rail, four wide in the stretch, was outfinished. TAMAH I broke sharply, allowed to settle, tracked the leaders from the inside, failed to menace. MAGIC THUNDER broke sharply, pressed the pace from between horses, weakened after the half. SPICY HOT WASABI slow early, showed little and was never a factor.
