Footnotes

HIGH END MAN broke sharply and tracked the leader while racing one from the rail through the second turn and into the backstretch, engaged the leader approaching the final turn, quickly took command and drew clear through the stretch. TIMELESS STORM away alertly and raced to the lead from along the rail entering the first turn, was collared by HIGH END MAN entering the final turn, was no match for that rival through the final furlong but battled gamely through the stretch to hold the place. DOUBLE IT unhurried early while angling in to race one from the rail through the first turn, tipped five wide approaching the second turn, raced wide through the turn and into the backstretch, advanced four wide approaching the final turn, rallied two from the rail through the final turn and closed willingly through the stretch while no threat to the winner. WAILIN' JACK stalked the early pace while racing along the inside, held a striking position down the backside but faded over the final furlong. SILVER RULER away well and stalked the leaders racing three wide into the stretch the first time, raced four wide through the second turn, began to lose contact with the top pair soon after entering the backstretch and weakened. TOMMY D' HORSEY stalked the pace through the stretch the first time racing one from the rail, raced three wide around the second turn, and began to weaken in the run down the backside.
