**Footnotes**

FANCY TRAIN stalked the pace three wide through the turn, bid leaving the turn to get nearest to the pacesetter then edged away the final eighth. DESERT BAY forced in early, settled off the pace while off the inside, bid four wide into the lane, looked to be a serious threat to the winner inside the sixteenth pole then hung late. SUNDAY MISSILE was brushed by a rival early, chased the duel through the turn while in the three path then lacked the needed response late. BE A BIDDER was under pressure while setting the pace into the lane then gave way outside the eighth pole. SIR SHAUN was along the rail through the turn, angled widest for the drive and never factored. RYANS JOY pressed the pace two wide through the turn then faded in the lane.
