STAKES Golden Bear S. Listed - Thoroughbred

THREE YEAR OLDS AND UPWARD. By subscription of \$50 each which shall accompany the nomination, \$250 to pass the entry box and \$300 additional to start, with \$100,000 added. After payment of 1% to all owners of horses finishing sixth through last, purse to be divided 60% to the winner, 20% to second, 11% to third, 6% to fourth and 3% to fifth. Three year olds, 118 lbs; Older, 124 lbs. Non-winners of \$45,000 at a mile or over in 2012 allowed 3 lbs; Of \$25,000 twice at a mile or over in 2012 allowed 5 lbs; Of \$25,000 twice at any distance in 2012 allowed 7 lbs. Starters to be named through the entry box by the usual time of closing. The field will be limited to 12 starters. If more than 12 horses pass the entry box, preference will be (1) high weights (2) highest 2011-2012 earnings. Entry fee only will be refunded if failure to draw into race. Trophy to the winning owner. Management reserves the right to cancel this stake with less than six betting interests.

Footnotes

IT HAPPENED AGAIN settled off the early pace while never far back, bid three wide into the mid-turn, gained a clear advantage straightening in the lane then extended the margin the final eighth. FAST ALEX was unhurried early while off the inside, bid four wide and with the winner in late turn, could not keep up with that one while finishing clear for the place spot. THUNDER AFFAIR pressed the pace two wide through the turn, remained in contention entering the lane but lacked a closing response. MOE MAN tracked the pace from along the inside down the backstretch, bid into the turn to gain a short lead then tired thereafter. CHILLED chased the pace from the two or three path into the turn, came widest in the lane and tired. BELLACHINO set the pace into the turn then retreated.
