LEAD THE WAY settled in hand along the inside, advanced between horses through the turn, shifted out entering the stretch, wore down the leader inside the furlong marker and edged clear. GOLD BELLS SPIN stalked the pace, launched his bid four wide, gained a brief lead inside the quarter pole, kept on well but was unable to resist the winner. MAJOR WINTERS was allowed to settle, moved up four wide leaving the turn, kept on fairly well and was up in time to earn the show. STORM MAKE'N opened clear to set the pace, was collared leaving the quarter pole and gave way readily once headed. MCBURNS saved ground to little avail. AL BASHA was unhurried into stride, angled out six wide and finished with a belated gain. GRAND PIANO MAN passed the tiring ones. STAYONIT was forwardly placed, tucked in to save ground, but came up empty entering the stretch and dropped out. BLINGBOY chased four wide through the turn and stopped.
