Footnotes

SIR SHACKLETON leaned in at the start bumping OLD DEUTERONOMY, was never far back while following the leaders four or five wide, inched to challenge in the upper stretch and was kept to his task to edge clear. MISTY APPEAL went up early to vie for the lead from between foes, gained the advantage, drew clear on the turn, lost the edge to the winner in the upper stretch and continued on as easily second best. MR. TRIESTE angled inside nearing the end of the backstretch, eased out four wide when straightened for the drive and couldn't threaten the top two. DETERMINED came out at the break jolting OLD DEUTERONOMY, was outprinted early, commenced a sweeping five wide rally approaching the stretch but was empty the last eighth. AMERICAN THUNDER drifted in at the start, hit the gate and continued in on GOLD GUNNER, was outrun to the lane and passed tired foes. OLD DEUTERONOMY, bumped around from both sides just after the start, went up soon after to force the pace three abreast, held on well for a half and tired. GOLD GUNNER, bumped at the start, raced three or four wide, attempted to drift out at the three-eighths pole, was straightened, then never menaced in the drive. BOSTON BRAHMIN, used early to race forwardly inside, was through upon going a half.
